VIEW FROM THE BRIDGE

Lessons from the Geese...and recognition of some of our lead gooses



Each October SOS takes a beautiful fall weekend cruise to the Corsica

River to enjoy nature's gifts... and the geese. There are lessons to be learned from the geese and their flight pattern as they soar forward - together. As each goose flaps its wings, it creates an "uplift" for the bird following. By flying in a "V" formation, the whole flock adds 71% more flying range than if each bird flew alone. Lesson: People who share a common direction and sense of community can get where they are going quicker and easier because they are traveling on the thrust of one another.

Each year in SOS, we recognize some of those who give our club its "flying range." As I was writing about this year's recipients, I noticed that for each I felt a need to include a description of their smiles, warmth, and energy.... Which made me reflect on that commonality. The positivity, get it done, and energetic willingness are characteristics so important to the growth and sustainability of our club.

The Commodore's Award

extends public recognition and many thanks to an individual who has made significant contributions in fostering the goals of Singles on Sailboats, and who continues to contribute to multiple aspects of the club. This year's honoree has been a member of SOS for many vears and held countless roles important positions that help hold the club together and achieve its goals of welcoming new members, providing education, and making memorable sailing adventures. This person sees what needs to be done and is among the first to

volunteer to do it. Known as "Ms NoVA SOS," Linda Casucci is a hostess, an arranger, an organizer, and an energizer. She brings new ideas to the table - it was her thought that SOS needed Fireside Chats during the summer to welcome, connect, and educate new members - especially those who may join after March's Spring Training - and so the formula for BBQ Chats arose. Linda has stepped up to fill in as Education co-chair more than once, timeless years as a lynchpin in Spring Training – it is there I had the first pleasure of knowing her, seeing her sparkling smile as she digs in to make that year's training work smoothly. Most recently she and Ellie have taken on the role of Membership Chairs and they are revamping the New Member Handbook, rewriting the role to reflect new social media outlets. as well as revitalizing the New Member Mentor program.

Years ago, an old Salt named Ed Klein initiated many of the ideas that have become SOS: he cosponsored the first rafts of two or three boats, the first brunches, the first social gatherings. But Ed offered more. He would teach you to sail without regard for your past experience or future expectations. Ed would take you aboard his boat, give you the helm, and develop your skills. He would challenge you to extend your horizons. He was one of those unique individuals who shared his joy of sailing with you. Though he has passed on, his spirit of sharing his love and knowledge of sailing remains with SOS. There are some adjectives may describe this year's award recipient while not touching the depth of his contributions: master coordinator... gracious host (both planned and unplanned).... active supporter.... wise organizer ...

omniscient yet subtle. Ned Schwartz is being honored with the designation of the Ed Klein Member of the Year. Ned and his sweet Molly have coordinated the Anniversary Weekend cruise with usually around a hundred participants, boats of all sizes and parameters... and they do it with a smile and a sparkle of joy. Ned has also welcomed hundreds of us into his and Molly's home for Thanksgiving dinners, Fireside Chats, and unexpected Chili tastings. Always with a sly smile and deep chuckle, anyone feels immediately comfortable in his presence. His clear explanations have helped developed the sailing skills of many. As an active First Mate for years, he has taken on the role of chairing that committee and developing a cadre of potential First Mates as well as including others in candidate support and in developing a Spring Training session. Ned's presence and smiling support are welcomed any time I see him. Most recently he has taken on the Fleet Exercises list which means he is looking at SOS happenings nearly three months in advance (which actually helps many of us with our planning and timelines). He also finalized the As Sailed list for this past sailing season. Though Ned tends to stay subtly in the background, he keeps an eye on what needs to be done and helps make it happen.

This next award, though it is not always given, is richly deserved by this year's recipient. Singles on Sailboats attracts many new sailors each year. And so the Board of Directors has established the **Rookie of the Year Award** to recognize the individual who, in his or her first year sailing with SOS, demonstrates superior
