Beginning with the January 2018 issue of the Whisker Pole, we will return to the former system of online access – the color version! - available to everyone online and the payment of \$20.00 to receive a hard copy monthly.



CURRENT MEMBER RENEWAL INSTRUCTIONS:

- You are a member or associate member as of December 31, 2016.
- You DO NOT meet the requirements of a LIFE MEMBER, or HONORARY MEMBER.
- FEES and MEMBER PROFILE:
- You pay the renewal fee
- You must update your Member Profile
- For online renewal, payment is by credit

card or check.

- For mail-in renewal, payment is by check only
- If you DO want to receive a printed newsletter, you MUST check appropriate box and pay the \$20 fee.

We had consciously planned to absorb the cost of sending a hard copy to all members for one year while analyzing the impact on participation. Although we had anticipated the reinstatement of the printed newsletter would impact members planning ahead for events and sailing opportunities, we found the greatest spikes in participation followed blasts, especially "Last Call" blasts; there was little correlation in participation to the receipt of the hard copy version.

New Members: First year membership of \$80.00 includes a \$10.00 one-time administrative charge. New members will have the option of receiving a free hard copy of the Whisker Pole during the first year of membership; upon renewal they will be able to opt in to continue receiving it with the same \$20.00 payment as current members.

Online renewal is preferred for all categories of membership. However, if you prefer, paper forms will be accepted.

LIFE MEMBER RENEWAL INSTRUCTIONS:

YOU ARE ELIGIBLE TO BE A LIFE MEMBER IF: you are 70 or older as of December 31, 2016 and you joined before March 31, 2009 and you have been a regular and/or associate member for over 10 consecutive years as of December 31, 2016. If you had any lapses in membership in the past 10 years, you are not a Life Member.

- FEES and MEMBER PROFILE:
- You do not pay the renewal fee. But you must email the Membership Chair if you were a dues-paying member this past year to get approval for Life Member status.
- You must update your Member Profile to prevent any lapse in membership.
- You must pay \$20 if you wish to receive a printed newsletter.

Every year, SOS members "reup" their membership, starting the first of November and ending December 31. For skippers, the process is just a bit longer, as we need to check information on your boats.

On the renewal form there is a section that reads: ALL equipment is required so make sure you click all and have all on your vessel.

Required Equipment for Sailing With SOS:

PFDs
First Aid Kit
Flares
Horn
Engine
Compass
VHF Radio
Bilge Pump
Fire Extinguishers
Throwable Life Ring or Sling
Through Hull Plugs
Enclosed head/approved MSD



Required Equipment for SOS Overnight Cruises:

Bow and Stern Lines Spring Lines (Min 2) Fenders (Min 2 Large) Running Lights Steaming Lights Anchor Light Refrigeration/ice Cooking - stove/oven



So, check this list when you renew your membership.

The Safety Committee will get a spreadsheet at the end of November, December and January, and we will process the approvals for boats as quickly as we can. Please don't wait until the sailing season starts in April of 2018 to get your boat renewal in.

You cannot be included in cruise coordination or join an SOS raft up if you are not on the approved list.

Requests for "rush jobs" will be viewed with proper skepticism. Ahem.

Cruising Corner

Laura Gwinn & Noreen McGuire, Cruising Chairs

What an exciting sailing season we had in 2017! A big thanks to outgoing Cruising Chairs **Carole Jordan** and **Meeps Yox.** The dynamite cruising schedule they put together generated a degree of participation that well exceeded the previous year. Take a look at this:

- 48 boats on the water with 169 crew for day sails.
- 200 boats on the water with 524 crew for weekend sails.
- The mini-extendeds had 16 boats for Memorial Day to Solomon's Island, 10 boats on Labor Day to Havre de Grace (in some wet and challenging weather), and 7 boats to St. Michaels for Oyster Fest.
- 8 raft captains built 15 rafts (3 cruises cancelled due to weather)
- 5 skippers sailed on 7 weekends, 4 skippers on 8 weekends, 2 boats on 9 weekends (combined skippers), and Ron Pence who sailed 11 weekends, carrying 32 crew in all. For day sails, there were 5 skippers who took crew for a total of 3 days, and 3 skippers who took crew for a total of 4 day sails. And we had 4 FMs who each sailed as FMs for 4 sails.

It takes a lot of behind-the-scenes work to make this happen: Lynn Gilley, coordinator liaison; Kathy Haven whose blasts inspired us all; John McDonald, data base chair, who kept it running smoothly; Jill Montgomery, Ned Schwartz, and Judy Crews-Hanks who generate the as-sailed lists; George Hollendursky who trains and

coordinates Raft Captains; and **Shirley Brooks-**

Hollendursky who sends out the Survey Monkeys after each



cruise. There were 31 coordinators (some more than once). And, of course, our coordinator extraordinaire **Barbara Wingrove**, who heads up the mid-week program and coordinated 7 sails.

By the time you read this, next year's planning will be well under way. Noreen McGuire and I, with the able tutelage of Carole and Meeps, hope to bring you another exciting and smoothly run 2018 cruising season. We would love for you to participate: attend a coordination, sail your boat, and sign up for sailing!

Exciting Brunch Speakers Coming Up!

December 3rd Brunch

Pride of Baltimore II is referred to as America's Star-Spangled Ambassador. **Pierre Henkart** claims it's always fun talking about Baltimore Clippers, which were the fastest ships on the seas 200 years ago and were highly successful privateers in the War of 1812! Since 2005 he has sailed the *Pride of Baltimore II* as a guest crew and over the years has sailed on various legs between Norfolk and Nova Scotia and the Great Lakes.



Thousands of people welcomed *Pride II* as she sailed from Norfolk, Virginia to Lunenberg, Nova Scotia and through the Great Lakes to participate in the Tall Ships Challenge. She has sailed for four decades and recently celebrated her 40th Anniversary. Since her commissioning she has sailed over 250,000 nautical miles and visited more than 200 ports and 40 countries in North, South, and Central America, Europe and Asia. *Pride II's* professional crew shares the story of Baltimore and the rich maritime history of the Chesapeake Bay. *Pride of Baltimore II* is part of Maryland Fleet Week, the Air Show of Baltimore and the Great Chesapeake Bay Schooner Race.

Pride of Baltimore was the first Baltimore Clipper ship to be built in 150 years and the first to represent Baltimore and the State. After the tragic sinking of the original *Pride of Baltimore* off the coast of Puerto Rico, overwhelming support replaced her with *Pride of Baltimore II*, as a memorial to *Pride*.

February 18th Regional Brunches. The always popular Regional brunches return! Kidde Recalls Fire Extinguishers

Kidde has recalled more than 40 million fire extinguishers used in homes, vehicles, **and boats** because they can become clogged or fail to discharge during a fire.

The company has received one report of a related death in 2014, when a fire extinguisher failed to work during a car fire. There have been 16 injuries, 91 reports of property damage, and 391 reports of the extinguishers either not working at all or not working properly.

The fire extinguishers were sold under dozens of different brand names, all listed on the Consumer Product Safety Commission recall notice. The recalled fire extinguishers came in red, silver, and white and were sold nationwide for \$12 to \$200 at department stores, hardware stores, and home improvement stores, as well as at online retailers, including Amazon and ShopKidde.



What to Do: Kidde is offering free replacements to anyone who owns one or more of the recalled units. "Consumers with a recalled fire extinguisher should contact Kidde right away," Wallace says.

To claim a replacement, check the brand name and model number of your fire extinguisher against the CPSC recall notice. The model numbers are printed on the body of the fire extinguisher (see photos above and below). You can call Kidde at 855-271-0773 or visit the Kidde website, where you can fill out a form to get a new unit.

Kidde says it will ship the replacement within 10 to 15 days of getting your information. No receipt is required. The company is asking consumers to keep their current model until they get the new one. It will arrive with instructions on how to return the old one.
