Notice of General Membership Meeting March 11th

Minutes from Town Hall General Membership Meeting - August 12, 2017

Meeting Called to Order: 7:06

Commodore set the purpose of the General Membership meeting as introduction and filling nominations for the seats of outgoing Board members. She reviewed the posted agenda which included space for contributions to New

Business topics.

Commodore first recognized a Skipper Emeritus, Bennett Kaufmann and presented a certificate with the acknowledgement.

- Brian Guptil as liaison to Safety chair Beth Dumesco and to Skippers Advisory chair Mike Swift
- Jon Halpern as liaison to Bareboat Chair Kathy Haven and to Database Chair John McDonald
- Alan Osterholm as liaison to Education Chair Emil Becker and holding the position of an open committee in Public Relations/Communications.

Additionally, Commodore recognized the many behind the scenes volunteers who arrange Dockside Training, maintain As Sailed lists, coordinate sails and other crucial roles.

Commodore introduced Nominating Committee Chair Rebecca Strandberg who introduced her committee members and summarized the search for nominees. Six nominees provided speeches – Beach, Becker, Gonski, and Laws spoke in person; Rosswork was represented by Meeps Yox and Scofield was represented by Linda Casucci.

Old Business:

Brief overview of the Newsletter costs and impact on budget; reminder that budget cycle would begin in October. Members suggested: charge \$26 for hard copy; increase dues; if people are enthusiastic for a hard copy they will pay for it; questions about how many are sent out. (monthly numbers are part of Board/Newsletter cmte reports)

Kathy Haven reviewed current votes on fall Bareboat trip locations – Lake Champlain and San Juan Islands were currently tied.

Laura Gwinn reminded members that Annual Award nominations are requested.




From Route 50 heading toward the Bay Bridge, cross the Severn River Bridge, then take exit 28 toward Bay Dale Drive; go 0.2 miles. Turn RIGHT onto Bay Dale passing back over Rt. 50; go 1.2 miles. Turn LEFT at 2nd light onto College Parkway; go 0.5 miles then turn RIGHT at first light onto Shore Acres Road; go 1.2 miles. Turn LEFT onto Bayberry Drive; go 0.4 miles. Bear LEFT at the fork onto Lynch Drive; go 0.6 miles. Turn RIGHT into The Barn parking lot just after a long stand of pine trees on the right.

From Rt. 2 (Ritchie Hwy.) in Arnold, turn onto College Pkwy; go 2.4 miles. Turn LEFT onto Shore Acres Rd; go 1.2 miles. Turn LEFT onto Bayberry Dr. then LEFT at the fork onto Lynch Drive as above.



For 16 days, from August 27th to September 12th, **Carole L owry** and her American Red Cross partners were deployed to Houston post Hurricane Harvey. They were an eclectic group from many parts of the USA and their abilities varied as greatly as their appearance. They sought out, fed, clothed, sheltered and supported the victims in Harvey's wrath. Many of these victims lost every personal belonging as they watched their homes destroyed and their lives changed forever.

Carole has been asked by many Registered Nurses (and there are a few in the Singles on Sailboats community!) how they can assist the American Red Cross. It is not difficult and since many of our members are retired, they often have the time. The American Red Cross Disaster Health Services Team is made up of EMTs, Para Professionals, Mental Health Workers, Case Managers and many other members of our professions. In addition, the Sheltering Staff provide a safe haven for disaster victims, Logistics and Disaster Assessors provide analysis and estimate the immediate needs response, Information Techs are our computer gurus and in the Houston area Interpreters were essential. You may be surprised how your expertise may be needed with or without a healthcare background.

Heading down to Houston, Carole partnered with another driver of our Emergency Response Vehicle (ERV); a box truck set up to serve food to victims and first responders in the field. Needless to say, many ERV drivers are needed to accomplish this huge task. Truck drivers are also needed for the 18-wheelers that drive to disasters with the many items necessary for temporary living and housing. Around 1.9 million people lost their homes to Harvey.

Carole's job was as a "Hot Shot" with 2 to 3 staff who went out into the field door-to-door seeking out victims who had remained behind and some that had returned to clear out what was left. They replaced lost medications, eye glasses, hearing apparatus and durable medical equipment; they assessed health issues and found medical care for those that needed urgent and emergency issues addressed; and they provided fresh water and sheltering where needed. Nurses and EMTs are also stationed in the shelters to address health care issues and find resources for those in need of healthcare.

She was quite exhausted after 16-hour days, up at 0500 every day, and only one day off. Carole was ready for her flight home and upgraded to first class for the pure

satisfaction of a comfortable ride. Altogether, an exhausting and rewarding experience.

February is one of **C. J. Corneliussen's** favorite months! For one thing, it has the highest chance of snow. Perhaps it's because his dad was Norwegian, but he loves snow! He realizes he is quite in the minority here, but he grew up in Santa Cruz CA, which was its own little heaven, But the temperature range year round was roughly 63 to 73. He always wanted to live where he had a change of seasons and is now delighted to be here and have them.

As to snow ... he loves to watch it, walk in it, play in it... even shovel it (within reason). And if it's really bad, there's always a neighbor with a snow machine or a student looking to earn a little money. Things to do? Also consider taking one of the various Coast Guard courses or an online boating course or lay out your entire boating season. His winters fly by. This year he is sorting the house top to bottom and planning to complete an online sailing course.

Sandy Rosswork reminds us that about 15 SOSers will be happily sailing in the BVI's in early February. All of the usual bars and restaurants may not be rebuilt yet, but the sun, sea, wind and snorkeling will all be great! She's certain that they will find sufficient food and drink along the way.


