Following this event is a Lunch and Learn Sailing Orientation Day and a Meet and Greet Happy Hour gathering. On Sunday, SOS skippers are offering Dockside Training and some may even leave the dock for a sail!

### Lunch and Learn Sailing Orientation Day Saturday, April 21

Join new members, potential members, I-haven't-sailed-in-a-while members, and other interested parties for a **Lunch** 'n Learn Sailing Orientation Day from 11:30-5:30.

The orientation will be held in Edgewater at the Kiwanis Club and is designed to answer all your questions – even those you didn't know you had! How do I sign up to sail? How do I pass Basic Skills? What are Basic Skills? What does the crew expect of the skipper? And what does the skipper expect of me? How do I plan and prepare food? What does "raft up" mean? (that was asked at our FUNdamentals of Sailing seminar just last month! It is a real question!)

With a variety of activities and speakers, our Lunch 'n Learn will answer your questions about sailing with SOS as well as review skills and sailing knowledge – you will feel ready to get out on the Bay and share time with friends. We plan

sessions on Provisioning 101 – what to bring and how to pack it; Aids to Navigation – what you will see when out on the Bay; Getting from Point A to Point B – wind, charts, and points of sail; Cruising and Rafting Etiquette ... and so much more.

Our Cruising and Social committee chairs will share how to sign up, sign in, and participate in activities and our Safety chair may even have a Weather the Weather fashion demo for us.

We will have a number of members and skippers joining us throughout the day, giving you chances to meet more people face to face.

Lunch and snacks as well as beverages will be provided and you will leave the day feeling more confident in your knowledge of what to bring, what to wear, what is expected, and how to do it all.

We are also planning an informal Meet and Greet gathering following the Lunch 'n Learn (around 5:30) at The Pier 7 Restaurant in Edgewater (formerly Coconut Joe's). Skippers and members will be encouraged to join us for a happy hour chew and chat time where you will have additional opportunities to meet SOSers.

# Dockside Training Sunday, April 22

On Sunday we will meet dockside aboard member's boats in an all-day session structured to simulate an SOS cruise. The Skipper and First Mate will conduct standard pre-cruise

information and safety briefing, and will then work with attendees to provide hands-on training about all aspects of the boat and how it works. For those attendees who are ready to do so, it is usually possible to complete some of the Basic Skills I & II checkout requirements as well.



If the weather cooperates and the boat is ready, you may be able to sail a little even though it is not part of the expected Dockside Training.

### DIRECTIONS

#### Eastport Fire Station, 916 Bay Ridge Avenue, Annapolis.

The fire station is located across from the Eastport shopping Center near Severn House (corner of Jefferson and Bay Ridge Ave.). But the best way to get there is to come up Bay Ridge from 6th Street (it is one way and the fire station is just before the two way merge with Chesapeake.)



#### The Barn at Ulmstead Estates, 911 Lynch Drive, Arnold, MD 21012

From\_Route 50 heading toward the Bay Bridge, cross the Severn River Bridge, then take exit 28 toward Bay Dale Drive; go .2 miles. Turn RIGHT onto Bay Dale passing back over Rt. 50; go 1.2 miles. Turn LEFT at 2<sup>nd</sup> light onto College Parkway; go .5 miles then turn RIGHT at first light onto Shore Acres Road; go 1.2 miles. Turn LEFT onto Bayberry Drive; go .4 miles. Bear LEFT at the fork onto Lynch Drive; go .6 miles. Turn RIGHT into The Barn parking lot just after a long stand of pine trees on the right.

From Rt. 2 (Ritchie Hwy.) in Arnold, turn onto College Pkwy; go 2.4 miles. Turn LEFT onto Shore Acres Rd; go 1.2 miles. Turn LEFT onto Bayberry Dr. then LEFT at the fork onto Lynch Drive as above.

Take Rt 50 East to Exit 22, Riva Rd. Follow signs to Riva Rd. and make left at light onto Riva Rd. Second light, left onto Holiday Court.

Follow Route 214 about 5 miles, through Mayo to Beverly Beach, passing an "Entering Beverly Beach Community" sign. Then same as above


