Cruising Word of the Month: **TIMELINESS**.

For SOS members this means signing up in a timely fashion, i.e., well before the deadline. For crew, it increases the likelihood the coordinator can place you; for skippers, it helps the coordinator assess her ability to place crew.

Timeliness is also important for crew and accepting inviting invitations. Skippers: call or email your offered crew within 24 hours of speaking with the coordinator. Crew: respond promptly to phone calls or e-mail invitation could be (your rescinded!).

Finally, be on time the day of the cruise. Skippers usually select a time to leave the dock based on distance, weather, and the time the raft building will begin. You don't want to be late!

There are lots of great cruises on the schedule for May:

 Shakedown Cruise/Cinco de Mayo on May 5-6. Tacos and margaritas for dinner, maybe?

- The very popular DNR cruise May 19-20; you definitely want to sign up early for this one.

Unofficial notes April 5, 2018 Board Meeting

Official March minutes will be posted on the SOS web site when approved in May by the Board of Directors.

Commodore: Discussed efforts to find Education chair and reviewed past and upcoming education events.

Vice Commodore:

Treasurer: Presented current financial statements.

Bareboat: For the Lake Champlain Cruise: A skipper has replaced the one who cancelled and has invited 5 of the 7 people left ashore to join him and his significant other on the second catamaran. Currently working on placing the remaining two crew. The second deposit is due in April and the skippers and crew were notified via email, Whisker Pole and the Simplesite website. Coordinator Michael Sommers is currently addressing the travel insurance piece and we hope to have that secured by the May meeting.

A survey has been sent to all the members asking them to choose between a destination of Belize or St. Lucia. Frank Hopkins has graciously agreed to coordinate that cruise.

Brunches: Brunches are over until Fall of this year. After the new Brunch dates have been determined, I will make an appointment to firm up those dates and menus with the Doubletree caterer. She has confirmed, to date there are no food price increases.

Cruising: The first cruise scheduled for the weekend of April 14. Unfortunately, there was a dearth of boats and crew to sign up. The two boats that did sign up may not be ready. Cruising kick-off was on March 25 at the Doubletree Hotel. There were approximately 50 attendees, including 30 skippers. We broke out into 3 groups (skippers, coordinators, First Mates) for short meetings. An hour-long coordinator training was presented by Lynn Gilley. Upcoming sails include; April 18 mid-week day sail, May 5-6 for Shakedown Cruise. The coordinator for the Memorial Day weekend cruise to Solomon's advises that 18 boats have signed up so far.

Database: Have identified 27 Life Members with no login activity for over a year. Have starting trying to contact these members to determine with they are still alive. The 2018 calendar has been updated and sails will be opened for registration as details are published in Whisker Pole. A hard copy of sailing calendar is available for download on website

Education: Planning and advertising continues for the Lunch and Learn. Fireside Chats and Seminars have been well attended.

Membership: Membership packets have been sent to seven new members and one new skipper.

First Mates: On March 25th Bill Knapp (one of our FM Candidates) stepped up to facilitate the First Mate portion of

the Cruising Kickoff along with Kitty St. Romain. Four First Mates and two Candidates participated. Questions and recommendations were put forward. Plans are being put together for the First Mates Meeting/Party on June 16. Discussions are moving forward for the activities for the First Mates Cruise on July 21-22, in conjunction with the Lollypop Cruise. In process of verifying First Mate Status and/or availability of team members to participate in this year's sailing season. Will be working with Safety Committee to update the First Mate Candidate Checkout Skipper list.

Newsletter: The April 20-page Whisker Pole was mailed to 89 members and 29 Happy Hour coordinators and were printed at a cost of \$ 420.55 which equates to \$3.89 per copy. There has been no coordinator for the North Baltimore Happy Hour for the last three months. This event will be removed from the Happy Hours printed in the newsletter and should be removed from the web page and Meet Up. I understand from Barbara O'Brien (previous coordinator) that the majority of the attendees are non-SOS people and no new member has been recruited in several years from this gathering. She has contacted several SOS members, none who are willing to become the coordinator

Public Relations: No report

Safety: The Safety Skills Hands on planning is well underway and am still recruiting volunteers.

Skippers' Advisory: Have identified only one new skipper and boat joining in this year. This skipper is getting TLC. There are 12 boats that fell off last year's list. Two were found to have forgotten to re-up. One dropout recounted a lack of sensitivity on the part of the club when he was incapacitated by major illness. Led a discussion on how to enlist new boats and skippers.

Social: The March Spring party posted a profit of around \$279 minus credit card/clicks The DNR planning is done, looking for volunteers to help set up/break down. The Anniversary Party planning commenced. We will have a 40th anniversary party, ruby stone is traditionally the gift so members will be encouraged to wear something red. We still need an event manager, band, caterer, memorial gift suggestions etc.

DNR, 632 Wye Island Road, Queenstown, MD 21658 From Bay Bridge (East bound):

Travel 12.5 miles eastbound on Route 50 and turn right onto Carmichael Road. Travel 5.1 miles on Carmichael Road until you cross the Wye Island Bridge. From the Wye Island Bridge, travel south on Wye Island Road for approximately 4.2 miles. Numerous public parking areas are available along Wye Island Road.

From Easton (West bound):

Travel westbound on Route 50 to the Maryland Route 213 traffic light. Continue west on Route 50 for three miles and look for sign (Wye Island NRMA). Turn left onto Carmichael Road. Travel 5.1 miles on Carmichael Road until you cross the Wye Island Bridge. From the Wye Island Bridge, travel south on Wye Island Road for approximately 4.2 miles. Numerous public parking areas are available along Wye Island Road.



The race results of each sailing event will be combined with the fundraising of each skipper and crew and calculated into their final standing for the Trip Crown Trophy. The trophy presentation will be held in October, 2018.


