# Unofficial notes November 10, 2019 Board Meeting

**Former Commodore:** Lead discussion about reimbursing expenses with a receipt. Motion made and carried that no expenses will be reimbursed without a receipt. Commodore expressed thanks for support in the past year.

# What on earth is SASSY vou ask?



SASSY is a new event that will combine three of our traditional events into one day: Awards, Spring Training, and Photo Retrospective. SASSY will bring new members and old salts together for a day of training, SOS Awards and a view of what we do year-round through pictures.

The day will begin with training sessions in the morning and then move onto lunch, awards and the life of SOSers in pictures (aka The Retrospective and The Photo Contest).

### **CANAL CRUISING IN FRANCE!**

What - The next Bareboat cruise is a canal boat trip on two beautiful canals leading to vibrant and historic towns in France and Germany. Boaters will enjoy lake resorts, village cafes, towering castles and magnificent cathedrals. The cuisine is a wonderful blend of French and German favorites. Strasbourg is one of the highlights of this trip. Strasbourg is a city of canals, half-timbered houses and flowers everywhere. The many cafes offer great food, local wine and German beer. There are bike paths along most of the route. Geographically, this cruising area is in Eastern France, along the border with Germany and not far from Stuttgart. It is part of the Rhine River Valley.

**When** - We are having five canal boats held for us for a two-week period in 2020. There will be a one-week trip from Hesse to Boofzeim, and the following week, there will be a one-week trip in the other direction from Boofzeim to Hesse. The first week is from September 4 to 11, 2020. The second week is from September 11 to 18, 2020.

**Cost**- The cost is \$1000 per person for all participants. This includes a \$60 admin fee for members and basic insurance. This price does not include any associated travel, provisioning and extras for the boat such as bikes. A deposit of \$400 pp is needed along with an application form (found on the club website).

**Travel** – international flights go to both Strasbourg and the Metz/Nancy airports. A travel option to Metz/Nancy with an extra day at an area hotel is being explored. The hotel and transportation to the base would be at additional cost.

### So, What Are The Serious Board Awards?

<u>Commodore's Award</u>: The Board of Directors established the annual Commodore's award so that the highest ranking officer of the Club could extend public recognition and many thanks to an individual who has made significant contributions in fostering the goals of Singles on Sailboats, and who continues to contribute to many aspects of the Club. Nominations for the award are accepted from the general membership.

Ed Klein Member of the Year Award: Singles on Sailboats owes its beginnings to Ed Klein. He cosponsored the first rafts of two or three boats, the first brunches, the first social gatherings. But Ed offered more. He would teach you to sail without regard for your past experience or future expectations. Ed would take you aboard his boat, The Mai Kai, give you the helm, and develop your skills. He would challenge you to extend your horizons. He was one of those unique individuals who shared his joy of sailing with you. Ed sailed beyond this world in 1987. Nominations for the award come from the general membership.

Elinor W. "Elli" Abramson Award Contributions to SOS Education Programs: Eli Abramson created many educational new programs for the members of Singles on Sailboats. After serving on the Board of Directors for two years, she gradually built an allencompassing education program that provides the opportunity to broaden one's knowledge of sailing at minimal cost. She transformed the spring education program so that it attracts more participants than any other SOS event. Elli sailed beyond this world in 1992. Nominations are accepted from the general membership, and the Education Committee Chairperson(s) recommends the recipient.

Rookie of the Year Award: Singles on Sailboats attracts many new sailors each year. The Board of Directors established the annual Rookie of the Year Award to recognize the individual who, in his or her first year sailing with SOS, demonstrates superior interest in and learning about sailing, and who becomes highly involved in one or more of the many SOS programs. Nominations for the award come from the general membership.

## You Ought to be in Pictures: The 2019 SOS Photo Contest, February 9th



Have you taken **stellar shots** of this year's SOS activities? If so, keep on shooting! If not, start taking photos to be submitted to the 2019 Photo Contest.

1. Entries must be taken at an SOS event in 2019 by the member of SOS submitting the photo. A photo does not

necessarily have that event as a theme (a picture of Annie Anchorage at a raft-up or the sunset seen from a raft-up is acceptable, even though there is nothing in the picture to prove that it was taken at a raft-up or cruise.) We are on the "Honor System". An official SOS event can be cruising, day-sail, a brunch, seminar, destination cruise, etc. Happy Hours are not included.

- 2. Each photo **must** identify at which SOS event it was taken and the name of the photographer.
- 3. This is an amateur photographer contest. Professional photographers i.e. anyone who earns more than 50 percent of his or her annual income from photography are excluded from the contest.
- 4. Each member may submit up to a **total of eight (8) photos**.
- 5. Photos may be edited to achieve color balance that reflects the scene as you observed it. Cropping is also acceptable. Heavily manipulated photos are **not** eligible.

**Categories:** People, Bay scenes (including sunsets), Sailboats (sailboats under sail, raft-ups), and Destination Cruises. The Destination Cruises category includes photos taken during the actual SOS destination cruises and photos taken on days when traveling prior to or after a destination cruise.

**Other Useful information:** Submit your photos in digital format. Send photos attached to emails or mail a disk that includes the photos. Submit photos in high resolution. The photos will be enlarged to 5" x 7", so if the photo is fuzzy, it reduces your chance of winning. Photos not submitted in the 5" x 7" format will be cropped to that format. Smart phone photos may be submitted. Please select high resolution for photos in your smart phone setup.

**Judging:** The photo contest managers will put your photos in the correct category. There will be 1<sup>st</sup> through 3<sup>rd</sup> place awards for each of the People, Bay Scenes, and Sailboats categories. There will be 1<sup>st</sup> through 6<sup>th</sup> place awards for the Destination Cruises category. There will also be a Grand Prize award. The photos will be judged by Don Dement, an Annapolis-area professional photographer from outside the club. The judging will be blind, so the judge will not know which photographer took any given photo.







