As spring unfolds, club officers and committee chairs are trying to keep up with the flow of Corona Virus directives through both **cancellations and rescheduling**. Our first meeting of April 9th went well, and we were able to continue conducting business almost as normal. The ad hoc Committee on Member Dues Restructuring, chaired by Lorraine Fassett, is working and

has reviewed a variety of financial scenarios going forward to 2030. **The scenario for our current situation is eye opening**; see it in the dues article on page 2 in this newsletter.

Our Safety Chair, Joan Tannen, is activating boats; and the Membership Committee is working on the 2020 membership directory.

Despite social distancing and stay at home orders, SOS Committee Chairs are rolling out some very cool things. Bill Knapp and the Education Committee are planning to unveil several online training events. These will be both educational and fun. Details are coming soon.

And.....have you logged into the SOS website recently? If not, you are in for a real treat! John McDonald, Data Base Chair, has been working on a major revision to virtually all categories of the website. Web site improvements increase clarity and make navigation intuitive and easy. Check it out!

In compliance with Governor Hogan's orders, our fleet of recreational vessels is presently confined to the dock. As restrictions are relaxed, we will also ease back into the sailing season, one careful step at a time. You will be kept informed as decisions are made.

Major Changes Considered for Membership Dues

Your Board of Directors is considering some changes to the dues structure of SOS. There are several reasons for considering change.

We are now in a situation where over 40% of SOS members are designated as Lifetime members and pay no dues. This is likely to place a financial strain on the club and place a financial burden on those members not eligible to become Lifetime members. Club leaders foresaw this situation more than a decade ago and placed a limit on the number of Lifetime members by making such designation contingent on: a) having joined the club by 3/31/2009 and b) having at least 10 years of membership.

Even with the stop date, there are more than 60 current members who joined the club before March of 2009 and will be reaching the required age of 70 in the not-too-distant future. Unless we add a significant number of new members, the proportion of non-dues paying members will continue to rise and will eventually become more than 50% of the SOS club membership. Financial modeling projects that if no changes are made to the current dues structure, and assuming that annual club administrative expenses remain the same, shortfalls will begin this fiscal year and increase every year going forward. These shortfalls will require drawdown from club reserves to cover operating expenses. In this scenario, annual budget shortfalls will exceed \$5900 by 2029 and club reserves will be greatly reduced, reaching \$0 by 2034.

In addition to the fiscal strain on the club, there is federal tax law which applies to SOS. There is an IRS ruling, applying to social clubs, that says you cannot have different classes of membership, such that one class pays substantially more in dues while both (all) classes receive identical benefits. Although it

is highly unlikely that the IRS will come looking at the SOS dues structure, it is also ethically and fiscally responsible to avoid a legal risk to the club's non-profit status.

In view of these issues, the BOD has approved an ad hoc committee, chaired by Lorraine Fassett, to review the fiscal and legal constraints. Our goal is to develop several options for change to the current dues structure. We plan to ask for input from club members before continuing to a final recommendation. Before any change is made to the dues situation of Lifetime members, there would need to be a bylaw change. Several options for a bylaw change will be offered for member discussion and input. A final option will be presented for a vote at the August Town Hall Meeting.

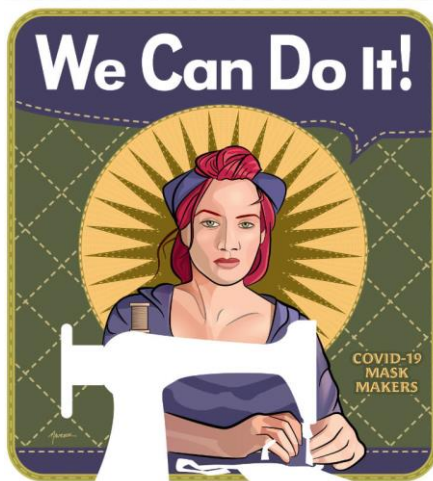
What has our SOS family been doing during this time of confinement since we can't be out sailing?

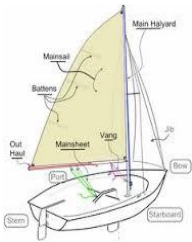
