



has two unstayed masts. After she lost *Ariel Song* she sailed *Strega* whose name was hand-painted by Duane Hull who had designed the SOS burgee and the Whisker Pole masthead.

Always sailing with Lindsay was Wickett, a Maltese terrier, whose personality made him a favorite sailing dog.

Lindsay was an active participant in the workings of SOS as Whisker Pole editor from 1993-96 and general "I'll help if I can" attitude. When with Lindsay, sailing became a class act with Waterford crystal and similar accompaniments part of the meal service. For those of us that had the privilege to sail with her, the experience was memorable.

Lindsay was married to Bobby Frey (one of the founders of SOS). After their divorce, Lindsay was not seen much in SOS as her final years were marred with bad health. A few select friends and Bobby made those years tolerable. Those of us who knew her savor those sailing memories and wish her peace.

Former SOS member Charles (Charlie) Van Doran passed away December 5 at the age of 87.

In Memory of Dorsey Owings

Former SOS Skipper Meredith Dorsey Owings passed away peacefully in his sleep in Chestertown, Md. on Dec. 9. He was 99 3/4. He lived his life fully, right up to the end, traveling in his RV from New England to Florida each year.



Farmer, trucker, sailor and traveler, Dorsey was born in Howard County, grew up on the family farm and took over its operation after his father died.

When developer James Rouse offered to buy the Howard County farm for his planned city of Columbia, MD, Dorsey used the proceeds to purchase several farms in Kent and Queen Anne's counties on Maryland's Eastern Shore.

In addition he bought a 40-foot Hinckley named Falcon and along with his wife and four children sailed south from Annapolis for a year of cruising the Bahamas and competing in the Southern Ocean Racing Circuit. He continued sailing for the next 40 years on the eastern seaboard, from the Bahamas north to the New England maritime.

Dorsey was an active skipper in SOS for many years, sharing his beautiful boat, skills, and love of sailing. One story told 'round the raft is at the age of 80 he rescued sailors from a catamaran during a gale on the Bay.

Ever the pragmatist, he made a decision that he was just worn out and would let things take their course. He stopped taking his medicine, made sure his beloved bulldog Macksie was provided for, expressed sincere gratitude to his friends and staff at Heron Point, then died in his sleep a few days later.

Dorsey is survived by a daughter, a son, and several grandchildren. Services for Dorsey will be private.

In Memory of Fritz Eisele
