There is plenty to get excited about in July with SOS Cruising activities. Don't let the warm weather keep you in. For openers we will celebrate

Independence Day with an overnight(s) cruise anchored for watching fireworks. There are fireworks displays being prepared for St. Michaels/Rock Hall on the 3rd and Annapolis/Kent Island for the 4th. Dinghy Dance - July 18

When you hear about a Dinghy Dance, do you envision dinghies waltzing together on the Chesapeake Bay? Or sailors standing in their dinghies doing the Macarena? Nope! The Dinghy Dance is an opportunity for you to practice the skills required to get in and out of a dinghy in the safety of a swimming pool.

These maneuvers are often tricky, especially for some of us who are less agile than we used to be. So, the Safety Committee is sponsoring a dinghy demonstration and practice exercise on July 18th in a private pool in Annapolis. (If registration exceeds limit, we will add a second day.)

The afternoon will begin with viewing videos and discussion on:

- USCG new labels on PFDs
- How to select, inflate and re-arm an inflatable PFD
- How to put on a PFD after you are in the water
- Dinghy safety tips
- How to re-enter a dinghy from the water

The video viewing will be followed by a practice session in the pool. Everyone will have to opportunity to put on a PFD after you are in the water, jump into water with PFD on, and practice a variety of maneuvers to get into a dinghy from the water. The practice will be followed by Q&A and refreshments around the pool while we dry off.

MANY HANDS KEEP SOS SAILING

We all love our fun and

adventurous cruises! We sail on safe boats, we have competent skippers, and we might also have a skilled First Mate on board. We sign up for a cruise, we list our skills and experience, and we are accepted on a boat going to an anchorage on the Chester River. So, what happens to make this work? Does the skipper know where to find the rafting spot? If it's a windy day, will a raft be safe? I'm in a small boat.....will this boat have a strong anchor? Lots of questions!

When I first sailed to an SOS Cruise, I was astounded! One had to wait to be called in and told exactly where and how to tie up! In my past experience, when you arrived at a club raft, you just joined by going alongside one of the boats. Was this safe? How many anchors were holding the raft? Turns out that many "simple" rafts were not safe at all, and I was involved in several middle of night raft breakups in other clubs which was neither fun nor safe! I'm thankful SOS has a winning formula!

Activated Boats - First, the club has a profile of each "activated "boat". This includes the boat length, freeboard (height above waterline), and details about anchor size and amount of rode (chain and line). The boat activations are the responsibility of our Safety Chair. Second, we have a trained Raft Captain who has this data about all of the boats who are registered for the cruise. He/she also knows if the skipper is brand new, or has been in numerous rafts.

Planning the raft - Using this data about boats and crew, the raft captain plans the raft. (See the article later in this newsletter for a great description

of building a raft.). Our skippers understand what's involved and why we do it in such a prescribed way. I sometimes grumble when I arrive at 2:00 and need to circle around until 3:00 before getting called to enter the Raft! But clearly, planning the raft type, boat placement, and number of anchors. makes good Everyone understands and supports SOS rafting procedures. SOS skippers have even been invited to give seminars at several area yacht clubs about the club's rafting process because we do it so well!

Passing lines - sometimes there are passing lines. These are strong lines which may be handed off to a boat in a raft and used to help guide a second boat as it backs into a raft. If not handled carefully, these can be dangerous. But, if handled by competent crew, they can be quite helpful. Again, training is key!

SOS Skippers - Finally, we have a cadre of skippers who bring a variety of boats to SOS events. Skippers are solely responsible for the upkeep and condition of their boats. Once underway, the skipper is responsible for the conduct of the vessel, and the safety of all onboard. He/she must know a great deal about navigation, the rules of the road, and boat handling. To assist our skippers, we have Skippers Advisorv Committee. These folks act as advisors and spokesperson to the skipper community and recommend actions to assist skippers and facilitate participation in SOS sailing.

Coming up, we have many more cruises. Some to a marina (Anniversary Party) and some to a club raft up (Wine and Chocolate cruise). Sign up and enjoy! Know that SOS has a lot of policies and procedures designed to keep everything both safe and enjoyable! See you on the water!





The SOS Scoop on Being a Raft Captain

One of the best things about SOS are the rafts. When we raft, we have a chance to make new friends, visit with old friends, eat, and drink. SOS has built rafts with just a few boats to a monster raft with 62 boats in June, 2002.

SOS rafts are either linear (boats in single line) or circular (boats in a circle). Circular rafts are usually built when there are more than 14 boats.

The individuals in SOS responsible for putting rafts together are **The Raft Captains**. Raft Captains are highly experienced SOS skippers. Raft Captains begin their training with a three- or four-hour seminar that is followed up with being mentored by an experienced raft captain.

Being a raft captain is one of the more difficult jobs in SOS with a great deal of responsibility for lots of expensive boats. The raft captain's job begins early in the sail. He or she must ascertain which boats on the cruise list are sailing by using a VHF radio check-in at 1315 (1:15 PM) hours. Raft captains usually arrive at the anchorage before the majority of the fleet and select a safe place to build the raft. The raft captain decides upon the arrangement of the boats in the raft. At the raft captain's order some boats are asked to put down anchors (and others are not). Finally, when all the boats are in the raft, the raft captain checks the lines between the boats and pronounces the raft closed. No more joyous words than that!

But the raft captain's job is far from over! Raft captains continually have to keep an eye out for the weather. Storms and wind changes can occur that make rafting dangerous and the raft captain can be faced with a decision to break up the raft and ask the boats to anchor individually.

Finally come morning, the raft captain has to announce the time for the raft breakup and the order in which the boats in the raft can safely leave the raft.

All this sound like fun? Might be difficult at first, but it is rewarding to know that you contributed to a safe and fun experience for your cruising friends and fellow skippers.
