Member Renewal -- Renewal period for 2023 opened November 1<sup>st</sup> and will run till January 31<sup>st</sup>. To be followed by a grace period of approximately 14 days.

**Education** – Spring Training planning continues with tentative date of April 1, 2023 at Anne Arundel Community College.

Friday night Zoom sessions have resumed.

Three Seminars have been scheduled by Shirley: 1/7/23, 2/11/23, and 3/4/23.

First Mates -- One FM still needs a renewal as of the end of the season, and will receive a one-year grace period to complete it. Many thanks to Joan Tannen, the checkout skippers, and the cruising coordinators in completing the five-year renewal task.

**Membership** – One new Member has joined SOS since October's BOD meeting. Two new Co-Chairs have stepped forward to be considered for approval by the BOD. Linda and Jon will continue as Committee Members to provide guidance and assistance as needed.

**Newsletter** – The 20-page November Whisker Pole was mailed to 76 members; 17 copies were mailed to Happy Hour coordinators. The total cost was \$397.79.

**Public Relations** -- Submitted bill to Treasurer for half-year fees for Meet Up site. We will collect hats, scarves, gloves at the December brunch for donation to an Annapolis non-profit. Working with Stout Gear for another opportunity to order SOS logo gear, potentially including some new items as well as a design for the Baja bareboat cruise.

**Safety** –Work on the Fitness Metric project is coming right along. We hope to have something in place to introduce to the club in the beginning of the New year.

**Skippers' Advisory** – The Zoom monthly Happy Hours for skippers continued through October with more than a dozen skippers attending. It has been seen as a positive venue for skipper dialog, questions and suggestions. Topics discussed included use of generators in rafts (negative about using them).

Unfinished Business: Motion by Pat Woodie regarding medical forms for bareboat cruises passed: "All Bareboat Cruise participants must provide a completed medical certificate to the skipper of their boat 30 days before the trip. The only acceptable form is the most current one provided on the Bare Boat site. This form will be submitted in a sealed envelope and only opened in case of emergency. This envelope will be returned to the participant at the end of the cruise. It is also recommended that each participant carry a second copy with them in case of some unforeseen circumstance."

<u>New Business</u>: New Board members were seated and officers elected. Committee Chairs Liaisons were formed

## Brunch – December 11<sup>th</sup> Sail Beyond Cancer

Harnessing the healing powers of wind, water, and sail, Ms. Suzanne Snyder Johnson established a group called Sail Beyond Cancer (<a href="www.SailBeyondCancer.org">www.SailBeyondCancer.org</a>) in 2014 after her own encounter with breast cancer. The idea is to take someone dealing with cancer, and five people they choose, out for a three-hour sail (at no charge to them) to take their mind off what they are going through and to give them a few hours of escape. She believes in the importance of taking time to celebrate life's beauty together, and do so by providing a unique therapeutic recreational experience for the whole family.

As part of SOS community outreach and donations, our club members have initiated a goal of collecting gloves, hats, mittens and warm clothing at the December brunch to donate to The Arundel House of Hope as we will connect with their

But Ed offered more. He would teach you to sail without regard for your past experience or future expectations. Ed would take you aboard his boat, The Mai Kai, give you the helm, and develop your skills. He would challenge you to extend your horizons. He was one of those unique individuals who shared his joy of sailing with you. Ed sailed beyond this world in 1987. Nominations for the award come from the general membership.

Elinor W. "Elli" Abramson Award Contributions to SOS Education Programs: Elli Abramson created many new educational programs for the members of Singles on Sailboats. After serving on the Board of Directors for two years, she gradually built an all-encompassing education program that provides the opportunity to broaden one's knowledge of sailing at minimal cost. She transformed the spring education program so that it attracts more participants than any other SOS event. Elli sailed beyond this world in 1992. 



- 1. Entries must be taken at events with other SOS members in 2022 by the member of SOS submitting the photo. Note: If you are in the photo, you cannot have been the photographer and your submission will not be accepted (unless on a tripod with a timer, which is acceptable). A photo does not necessarily have that event as a theme (a picture of Annie Anchorage at a raft-up or the sunset seen from a raft-up is acceptable, even though there is nothing in the picture to prove that it was taken at a raft-up or cruise.) We are on the "Honor System". An SOS event can be cruising, day-sail, a brunch, seminar, destination cruise, shore party, etc. Happy Hours are not included.
- 2. Each photo **must** identify at which SOS event it was taken and the name of the photographer.
- 3. This is an amateur photographer contest. Professional photographers i.e. anyone who earns more than 50 percent of his or her annual income from photography are excluded from the contest.
- 4. Each member may submit up to a **total of eight (8) photos**. The photographs should be submitted in a 5" x 7" format or the coordinator will crop it for you.
- 5. Photos may  $\underline{\text{NOT}}$  be edited to achieve color balance that reflects the scene as you observed it. Heavily manipulated photos are **not** eligible. Cropping is the only acceptable edit. We ask the photographer to 'Suggest' a category, but the Judge has the discretion to change the category.

Categories: People, Bay scenes (including sunsets), Sailboats (sailboats under sail, raft-ups), and Destination

Cruises. The Destination Cruises category includes photos taken during the actual SOS destination cruises and photos taken on days when traveling prior to or after a destination cruise, provided the photos are from the same area. destination cruise of the Mediterranean mav not include photos from layover in Amsterdam.)



**Other Useful information:** Submit your photos in digital format. Send photos attached to emails, Drop Box or contact Bob Wright for instructions to upload the Photo Editor's Google drive. Submit photos in high resolution. The photos will be enlarged to 5" x 7" (and larger to project to a screen). If the photo is fuzzy, it reduces your chance of winning. Photos not submitted in the 5" x 7" format will be cropped to that format. Smart phone photos may be submitted. Please select high resolution for photos in your smart phone setup.

Judging: The Photo Contest Manager and Judge may put your photos in the best applicable category. There will be First, Second and Third Place Awards for each of the four categories and also a Grand Prize Award. The photos will be judged by a greater Annapolis area professional photographer from outside the club. The judging will be blind, so the Judge will not know which photographer took which photograph. The Judge may add a fourth-place award in any category, if deemed necessary due to the quantity and quality of entries in a category (not to exceed a total of 13 awards including the Grand Prize Photograph).

## January 7<sup>th</sup> Seminar The Down East Loop

Please join us for an exciting presentation by SOS members Harry & Katie Keith as they share their adventures this past summer on the Down East Loop. They will discuss trip planning, boat prep, provisioning, marinas, moorings, highlights, mis-

You may have heard of the "Great Loop," a well-traveled nautical circuit that involves the Hudson River, the Erie Canal, the Great Lakes and the Mississippi River. This route through the Champlain continues uр the Hudson, Canal and Lake Champlain, the Richeleau River, Chambley Canal, finally turning East at the St. Lawrence River. The only way home from here is around the Gaspé Peninsula, down the East coast of New Brunswick, through the Northumberland Strait past Prince Edward Island then the Canso Strait past Cape Breton Island. From there, the Loop continues along the East coast of Nova Scotia, ultimately ending up back in US waters along the Maine coast.

# February 11<sup>th</sup> Seminar Marine Insurance: The Good, The Bad, The Ugly



In 2015, Jim Brooks and Cynthia Palmer lost their Pacific Seacraft Crealock 34 to vandalism while the boat was stored on land. The damage was extensive; their insurer offered them only 40% of the total insured value of the boat rather than

declaring the boat a total loss.

This seminar will detail the months-long steps they had to take to have the boat declared a total loss, resulting in 100% reimbursement of its insured value. The many critical aspects of boat insurance policies they learned about will be covered in this seminar. What you think your policy will cover and what your insurance company says it will cover is not always the same. **Bring your own policy and join the discussion!**


