## Spring Training, April 1<sup>st</sup> Anne Arundel Community College

In early April, the temperatures might still be low, and more than a bit of snow might still be lingering, but the sun is staying around in the late afternoon. The body clock screams, "sailing time, sailing time".

To prepare for sailing, we are excited to announce that Spring Training will have a diverse line up of 30 sessions. Starting with breakfast and opening remarks from our Commodore Carole Jordan, we then have six tracks from which you may choose five sessions based on your interest and skill level. Each session is identified with a L (Low experience in sailing), **M** (Moderate experience) or **E** (Experienced or skippers.). In the morning the sessions are 50 minutes long and after lunch the afternoon sessions are an hour and 20 minutes.

Examples of L sessions are Introduction to SOS, Basic Sailing Terminology and Basic Sailing Knots. If you are a new member, these are designed for you. For people with moderate experience, we have ABC's of Cooking Aboard, Docking and Boat Handling Under Power and Basics of Rafting, to name a few. If you are a skipper or have extensive experience such as first mates, sessions such as Celestial Navigation, Diesel Engines and Boat Electric Systems will expand your knowledge. Look for the Spring Training Matrix on pages 10-11 of this newsletter for the full list of sessions.

Due to the impact of Covid on food prices, we have had to raise the price a little bit over last year, keeping the increase to less than 10%. Prices are member early bird: \$85; after March 1st member \$95 and non-member & walk in \$100.

To wrap up the day we will have a Happy Hour at O'Loughlins Restaurant and Pub, 1258 Bay Dale Dr, Arnold, MD 21012. 4:00pm-7:00pm.



O'Loughlin's is about ten minutes from Anne Arundel Community College where Spring Training is held.

## Brunch – April 2<sup>nd</sup> Jahn Tihansky, Everglades Challenge Retrospective and General Meeting



Join us for Brunch at the Annapolis Doubletree Inn to hear Jahn Tihansky, head of the U.S. Naval Academy's Offshore Sailing Team, discuss how he won the Everglades Challenge which is a 300-mile expedition style adventure race for kayaks, canoes, and small boats, from Tampa to Key Largo.

Sailing on *Spawn* with Jeff Linton and OH Rodgers, Team Twobeers finished the challenge in an unprecedented 37 hours and 36 minutes. "*Spawn*" is the result of two years of tweaking to create the perfect boat that would crush the challenge. *Spawn* is a modified custom-built OH Rodgers with a broken Melges 20 mast, an A-cat boom,

bowsprit, and rudders. "Rodgers is a composite guy," says Tihansky, "and he put it together. With a plywood hull, the boat weighs just over 550 pounds.



Also, at this Brunch we will view the **2022 Retrospective** – a review of the SOS year through photographs and announce the **Photo Contest** winners.

Following the brunch all are invited to attend a **General Membership meeting.** As directed by our bylaws, the Treasurer will provide a budget update and overview, and each committee chair and/or their board liaison will share a summary of the 2022 year's highlights and a look ahead to 2023.

## February 11<sup>th</sup> Seminar Marine Insurance: The Good, The Bad, The Ugly



In 2015, Jim Brooks and Cynthia Palmer lost their Pacific Seacraft Crealock 34 to vandalism while the boat was stored on land. The damage was extensive; their insurer offered them only 40% of the total insured value of the boat rather than declaring the boat a total loss.

This seminar will detail the months-long steps they had to take to have the boat declared a total loss, resulting in 100% reimbursement of its insured value. The many critical aspects of boat insurance policies they learned about will be covered in this seminar. What you think your policy will cover and what your insurance company says it will cover are not always the same. **Bring your own policy and join the discussion!** 

## March 4<sup>th</sup> Seminar Raft Captain Training

Rafting is an important aspect of SOS cruising and doing it safely is critical. Learn how SOS builds linear and circle rafts, including where and how to set an anchor, place fenders, secure lines, approach in the wind, and effectively communicate both on the boat and with the Raft Captain.

This seminar is designed for Raft Captains, potential Raft Captains, Skippers, First Mates, and all Crewmembers. The session covers considerations involved in raft building such as

advance planning, general guidelines for all rafts, special considerations for circle and linear rafts, handling emergencies, docking for land-based cruises, and ways in which Skippers and Crew can assist the rafting process. There is no cost for Raft Captains, potential Raft Captains, First Mates and First Mate Candidates.



## **Fireside Chats**



Fireside Chats provide an opportunity during the non-sailing months to gather in a home to enjoy tasty food, libations, great company and hear a short educational presentation by an excellent speaker. For a \$20 fee Happy Hour and dinner are provided. Groups are small (15-25 usually) so you can get to know

## Training in CPR/AED and **First Aid for Mariners**

## Saturday, March 11

Once again, we are holding this important training session before the season begins to give us more instruction on safety. The Annapolis Fire Department emergency medical personnel will conduct this class on CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation), the use of the Automated External Defibrillator (AED) and first aid with a special focus on mariners. The training will be held at the Taylor Avenue Fire Station in Annapolis.

Because SOS recognizes the value of these important skills, the club pays half the cost of this American Heart Association certified training. Whether you are learning these techniques for the first time, or recertifying, there is always more to learn. Recommended procedures are always being updated. Certifications are valid for two years.

The class will start at 9:00 AM and run to approximately 4:00 PM. Your cost is \$48.00, which includes coffee and a light breakfast, as well as lunch. Attendees are required to be fully COVID vaccinated and boosted. The deadline for registration is March 4. ## Renew, Restore, Rewild: Three Innovative Projects Boosting Ocean Health

A deep dive into new initiatives supporting biodiversity – from the coastline to the seafloor

In a well-functioning marine ecosystem, everything is connected – from microscopic matter to massive aquatic mammals. If any one element becomes unbalanced, the ripple effects can be devastating.

This interconnectedness is one of the reasons why climate change is such a significant – and imminent – threat to the world's oceans. Katherine Richardson, a researcher of marine biology and biodiversity, notes that we're already seeing major disruptions in Earth's marine ecosystems: motile (moving) organisms migrating to new regions to escape warming temperatures, excess nutrient input from pollution affecting marine life, and coral bleaching, among other calamities.

Biodiversity is taking a huge hit in the wake of a changing climate – which in turn impacts climate mitigation efforts. "The biodiversity crisis is at least as important as the climate crisis," explains Richardson. "Biological processes, including both land and ocean photosynthesis, are critical for establishing sinks in the global carbon cycle. The way we change the biosphere's capacity for carbon storage is an integral part of the climate crisis."

Globally, organizations ranging from renewable energy companies to conservation groups to university research programs are collaborating to tackle the joint crises of plummeting biodiversity and ongoing climate change.
