SPRING TRAINING IS HERE AGAIN ON APRIL 6th By Jean Gough

Once again Singles on Sailboats brings a full day of educational sailing programs with Spring Training on Saturday, April 6th at the Anne Arundel Community College campus in Arnold, Maryland from 8:30 – 4:30. FOLLOWED BY – the AFTER PARTY at O’Loughlin’s Restaurant ... See details below.

Our 2024 Spring Training Team has put together a full program of sailing experts to engage all levels of sailors as you’ll see on the Spring Training Curriculum on pages 14-15.

The registration price includes a continental breakfast, a full lunch, and all classroom materials.

There are five “time tracks” and six “presentation choices” per track. You choose one presentation per track. Each presentation is tailored to a specific level of sailing experience. The three levels of training are designated as – “L”= limited to no sailing experience, “M”- moderate experience, “E” = experienced sailors or Skippers. Please see the Registration Instructions on pages 11-13 for more details.

For our long-term members, who have been enjoying Spring Training for several years, we are pleased to share that we also focused on offering brand new presentations. This resulted in eight new topics that had not been offered before. That’s more than 25% BRAND NEW PRESENTATIONS and speakers!

The Spring Training team also received requests to add more General Interest (GEN) presentations, which we are delighted to say has resulted in at least one GEN presentation in each of the five “time tracks”.

Class selections offer various topics such as sail trim, navigation, safety, docking, boat maintenance, anchoring, cooking on board, and much, much more. The general interest topics (GEN) include Lighthouses of the Chesapeake Bay, Early Chesapeake Bay History, and a first-hand account of a journey from England to Maryland in 1634.

Some of the sessions will include hands-on activities with the intent to have fun while learning new skills. What you will learn at SOS Spring Training 2024 will help make you a better sailor for Spring, Summer and Fall cruising!

A word of advice – sign up early because seating is limited in many of the seminars and workshops and the most popular topics fill up early. We look forward to seeing you there!

DON’T FORGET to plan on attending - The SPRING TRAINING AFTER PARTY - once again held at O’Loughlin’s Restaurant at 1258 Bay Dale Drive, just a short drive from the community college. O’Loughlin’s is delighted to have us back and has asked that we provide a headcount to

make sure they are adequately staffed and so that they can arrange the right space for us. **So please take an extra moment to register for this separately... see Fleet Exercises.**

There is no cost to attend the AFTER PARTY, other than the cost of your drinks and food. The registration request is simply to give them a head count in advance, so they are not “suddenly slammed” with 40+ new patrons without time to prepare.

Seminar Raft Captain Training February 17th with Chuck Fort, Crofton Library

Rafting is an important aspect of SOS cruising and doing it safely is critical. Learn how SOS builds linear and circle rafts, including where and how to set an anchor, place fenders, secure lines, approach in the wind, and effectively communicate both on the boat and with the Raft Captain.



This seminar is designed for Raft Captains, potential Raft Captains, Skippers, First Mates, First Mate candidates, and all Crew members.

The session covers considerations involved in raft building such as advance planning, general guidelines for all rafts, special considerations for circle and linear rafts, handling emergencies, docking for land-based cruises, and ways in which Skippers and Crew can assist the rafting process.

There is no cost for Raft Captains, potential Raft Captains, Skippers, First Mates, and First Mate Candidates. Crew cost is \$10. Crofton MD Library.

Seminar EZ Sextant App March 23, 2024

Navigate in open waters without a GPS, sextant, or internet connection using your smartphone. The EZ Sextant app uses the phone's camera to make celestial sightings and automatically plots the results for easy navigation. Use it as a GPS backup or in conjunction with your sextant to take advantage of the built-in almanac and plotting tools. Perfect for those who have a sextant but forgot the details in making a sighting.

Mike and Janet will provide an overview of the EZ Sextant smartphone app and what led to its development. They will also brush lightly on celestial navigation, GPS, and the need for a non-GPS backup when sailing in open waters. The app will be demonstrated, and participants will be allowed to try it out on several phones.



Money Talk

SOS has lost a modest amount of money in each of the 5 years. All of us who have run businesses know that is not good practice in the long term!

Those losses have been depleting our “reserves” and can continue to do so. But we need to keep in mind that all healthy businesses retain a certain level of reserves to weather unexpected challenges. In fact, it is best practice for non-profits to maintain adequate reserves to cover 1-2 years of operating expenses.

In looking at our expenses, the biggest single category is Catering for our various social functions including the shore parties (Anniversary, DNR and Seafood Feast), as well as Brunches, Town Hall Meetings and Spring Training. Our overall catering expense has increased by 71% since 2021 - but remember that in 2021 we were still recovering from Covid and had fewer events than normal (no Spring Training, fewer brunches). Looking at Catering on a more apples-to-apples basis, our expenses have increased about 30% over that period.


We’ve seen some sharp increases in other categories as well: notably, Dockage Fees which are up nearly 40%, the cost of producing the

Whisker Pole (up over 60%), the rental of the storage units where we maintain supplies including party equipment, supplies, and decorations (up 29%), and Insurance (up 14%).

At the same time, we have increased the fees for many of our events to help offset the rising costs. The Seafood Feast has gone from \$87 per person to \$108. Brunches have gone from \$31 to \$36. Spring Training has gone from \$55 to \$85. Most of these are directly related to increases in the cost of food. This should come as no surprise to anyone who has been to the grocery store lately!

The one thing that hasn’t increased is our Membership Fee which remains at \$60 this year. The last time our membership fee was raised was in 2018.

As we see how 2024 unfolds, the Board and Committee Chairs will continue to monitor our expenses closely and work to reduce them wherever possible. We likely will continue to adjust event fees and dues when and if prudent. As always, the Board is open to hearing your ideas and suggestions – either for areas where you think we can trim expenses, or where it makes sense to raise fees.

Have you taken **stellar shots** of this year's SOS activities? If so, keep on shooting! If not, start taking photos to be submitted to the 2023 Photo Contest.

1. **Entries must be taken at events with other SOS members in 2023 by the member of SOS submitting the photo.** **Note:** If you are in the photo, you **cannot** have been the photographer and your submission will not be accepted (unless on a tripod with a timer, which is acceptable). A photo does not necessarily have that event as a theme (a picture of Annie Anchorage at a raft-up or the sunset seen from a raft-up is acceptable, even though there is nothing in the picture to prove that it was taken at a raft-up or cruise.) We are on the "Honor System". An SOS event can be cruising, day-sail, a brunch, seminar, destination cruise, shore party, etc. Happy Hours are **not included**.

2. Each photo **must** identify at which SOS event it was taken and the name of the photographer.

3. This is an amateur photographer contest. Professional photographers - i.e. anyone who earns more than 50 percent of his or her annual income from photography – are excluded from the contest.

4. Each member may submit up to a **total of eight (8) photos**. The photographs should be submitted in a 5" x 7" format or the coordinator will crop it for you.

5. Photos may **NOT** be edited to achieve color balance that reflects the scene as you observed it. Heavily manipulated photos are **not** eligible. Cropping is the only acceptable edit. We ask the photographer to 'Suggest' a category, but the Judge has the discretion to change the category.

Categories: People, Bay scenes (including sunsets), Sailboats (sailboats under sail, raft-ups), and Destination

Cruises. The Destination Cruises category includes photos taken during the actual SOS destination cruises and photos taken on days when traveling prior to or after a destination cruise, provided the photos are from the same area. (A destination cruise of the Mediterranean may **not** include photos from a layover in Amsterdam.)




Other Useful information: Submit your photos in digital format. Send photos attached to emails, Drop Box or contact Bob Wright for instructions to upload the Photo Editor's Google drive. Submit photos in high resolution. The photos will be enlarged to 5" x 7" (and larger to project to a screen). If the photo is fuzzy, it reduces your chance of winning. Photos not submitted in the 5" x 7" format will be cropped to that format. Smart phone photos may be submitted. Please select high resolution for photos in your smart phone setup.

Judging: The Photo Contest Manager and Judge may put your photos in the best applicable category. There will be First, Second and Third Place Awards for each of the four categories and also a Grand Prize Award.
