Ahoy, Mates.

"Stuff Happens" or perhaps to us sailors, "Murphy's at the helm again." This month, Murphy came in hot.

Just as I was preparing to leave for a long-planned vacation, a large old Post Oak decided to abandon its watch, fall on my house, smash the deck, and end up leaning against the neighbors 'place—just feet from where I sleep. Bags packed, hiking boots, walking sticks, phone, batteries, iPad, and overseas adapters in every suitcase corner ready to roll down the runway!

Then, at 2 am: **Crack! Boom! Smash!** So much for my vacation "float plan." I'm glad to be alive.

It reminded me how often our sailing lives echo the unexpected turns of boating life. We reef the sails flying along in crisp winds, or head for a charted anchorage looking forward to sundown happy hour, trusting that the engine (just commissioned, of course) will run perfectly.

And then the storm kicks up and blows us aground. The engine overheats and shuts down. The towboat rescue creates more drama—and sometimes more damage—than the actual emergency.

Sound familiar?

What do we do? We adapt, patch, pivot. We rely on our SOS crewmates to secure the boat—PFDs on, anchor and chain down, someone calling the towboat, someone steady at the helm. We count on calm hands and reliable advice when the wind and waves rise. Their experience, knowledge, encouragement, and humor turn potential disasters into sea stories—ones we retell, refine, and embellish (just a little?) year after year. We learn from each event. We add to our growing collection of "Murphy" tales. We show up for each other. We adapt. We laugh (eventually). Sometimes we even take pictures unless Murphy took the camera overboard from its perch in the cockpit.

So, here's to the insurance company that answers the phone at 2:30 a.m.; the busy towboat operator who finally shows up; and the local (somewhere) marina that fixes the blown engine. Here's to our wonderful, experienced, and reliable SOS crewmates.

Here's to all the unplanned moments that make us better sailors—and sturdier people. Because in SOS, when "stuff happens," we call it another learning experience. Just another day.

Wishing all of you good humor—and a good working relationship with "Murphy at the helm."

Spring 2025 – New Zealand Coordinator: Deborah Kauffman Post trip party was held Saturday, May 31. Working on refund checks

Fall 2025 – Lake Huron - Coordinator: Carole Jordan. Week of September 7-13, 2025, Canadian Yacht Charter. Due to the death of the owner and the probate process, the trip has been cancelled by the charter company. We are currently researching several alternative locations with available boats. **Spring 2026 & Fall 2026** – We have a coordinator and backup coordinator for the 2026 spring trip and are working through some logistical details before we announce a destination.

For the May sails, we were able to get enough Skippers after sending out blast requests. Most sails were completed, with the exception of the Blue Angels day sail which most of the boats and the Blue Angels cancelled due to weather.

For June sails, we now have enough skippers for the FM cruise on June 14 but still need 2 - 3 boats for the General Cruise on that weekend. Currently, there are only 7 boats registered for the anniversary party, with a registration deadline of June 11. The extended cruise has been extremely successful with 8 boats reaching Yorktown and Cape Charles, as well as other points along the way. The cruise finishes this weekend.

Dockside Training July 19th

Dockside Training is presented by the Cruising Committee without cost to all SOS members. It is held on various members' boats to give newly joined members and old salts who want a refresher or an introduction to a boat, on sailing with SOS, and a head start on checking off some Basic Skills. It is traditionally held on a boat while tied to the dock, although some Skippers elect to go out for a day sail.

Dockside Training is designed to answer such questions as: What tasks do the crew perform on a boat? How do I tie a clove hitch or stopper knot? What am I expected to do when leaving the dock? And more...

Skippers and First Mates will conduct standard pre-cruise and safety briefings and provide hands-on training. This is an EXCELLENT opportunity to get your Basic Skills Level I and possibly some of your Basic Skills Level II training checked off. Completion of the Basic Skills Level I is a <u>minimum skill requirement</u> for sailing as a crewmember on a weekend cruise.

Preparing for Dockside Training Please read the Basic Skills Manual Level I and II sections prior to Dockside Training and <u>bring the</u> <u>Basic Skills checkout forms with you.</u> The Manual and checkout forms are found on the SOS website in the Education Section of the Forms and Such tab.

If you are preparing for Basic Skills I you must study the nomenclature, practice the knots, and review the man overboard procedures. If time allows your Skipper may start on the Basic Skills II review and/or checkout. If you are preparing for Basic Skills II please study the nomenclature, practice the knots, and review the points of sail. If time allows your Skipper may start on the Basic Skills III review and/or checkout.

After you register, your assigned Skipper will send an email with details about the boat location and other necessary information. Just pack your water bottle, picnic lunch, and Basic Skills form(s). Then head to your assigned SOS boat for hours of fun, learning, and camaraderie.



Please email your questions and request for directions to the coordinator.

If you are paying by check for any sailing event, a paper Sailing Registration Form must accompany the check mailed to the coordinator. A copy of this form can be found on the SOS website. All checks are to be made payable to SOS, Inc. The postmark is used as the mail in cutoff/deadline date.

Note: Individual request for refunds will incur a \$3 Administration Fee.

SOS Wellness Protocol Revised (3/7/2024)

All participants attending SOS in-person events should be feeling well. They should not attend an event if they have symptoms of a communicable respiratory or gastrointestinal illness, are "feeling like something is coming on," have a recent significant exposure to someone with a communicable respiratory or gastrointestinal illness, or have not waited a recommended isolation time after a recent respiratory or gastrointestinal infection. In addition, a skipper/host may have further requirements or request other preventive measures (for example, crew or guests having received the currently recommended COVID-19 vaccine or wearing masks when below deck). All in-person participants should expect to be denied admission without a refund if they fail to comply with this policy.




